Eligibility Requirements

In order to enroll in **on-campus**, **at-high school** or **online** dual enrollment courses, students must meet the following Initial eligibility requirements:

- Be a student enrolled in a partner Florida public, charter or private school or home school course of study that fulfills requirements for high school graduation
- · Have a 3.0 unweighted high school GPA
- Meet minimum score on a common placement test
 adopted by the Florida State Board of Education and the
 Florida Board of Governor Postsecondary College-Level
 Preparatory Testing standard scores which indicate that
 the student is ready for college-level work
- Home education student must provide proof of enrollment in home education program and be registered with M-DCPS, or Broward County Home School Office
- Meet any additional criteria set by FIU as the postsecondary institution

Students interested in the Full-Time/Dual Enrollment Early
Admission program must meet the following requirements:

- Be a rising senior in a partner Florida public, charter or private school or home school course of study that fulfills requirements for high school graduation
- · Have a minimum 3.5 unweighted high school GPA
- Have approval from a high school Counselor and Principal or Home School Liaison
- Have a minimum SAT score of 1200 (combined Verbal, Math, and Writing) or a minimum ACT composite score of 25
- Home education student must provide proof of enrollment in home education program and be registered with M-DCPS, or Broward County Home School Office.
- Meet any additional criteria set by FIU as the postsecondary institution.

Continued Eligibility Requirements

Continued eligibility to participate in the program requires that students:

- · maintain a 3.0 unweighted high school GPA (as applicable)
- · maintain the minimum postsecondary 3.0 cumulative FIU GPA
- · earn a grade of C* or better in all dual enrollment courses

These requirements extend to on-campus and at-high school programs. Continued eligibility will be validated by the FIU Dual Enrollment Office.

*A student who earns a grade lower than a "C" in a dual enrollment course is not able to continue participating in the program.

Additionally, students must meet required testing standards for enrollment in courses with pre-requisites or courses that require course level assessment. (i.e. ALEKS Math Placement Assessment)


