### **DUAL ENROLLMENT (DE) PROGRAM OVERVIEW**

In today's knowledge-based society and competitive, global economy, Dual Enrollment (DE) serves as a significant accelerated mechanism towards higher education degrees. The State of Florida DE 1007.271 Statute ("Dual enrollment programs") defines DE as "...enrollment of an eligible secondary student or home education student in a postsecondary course creditable toward high school completion and a career certificate or an associate or baccalaureate degree."

Access to education is a primary consideration in fostering local and regional economic growth and prosperity and improving life prospects. Today's marketplace requires a highly skilled and educated workforce—one with critical thinking, creative, and problem-solving skills. In developing a more accessible approach to meeting educational needs, coordination and cooperation among educational leaders serve as an essential building block for community success.

As a conduit to higher education and degree attainment, DE creates and sustains talent and develops critical educational pathways. Florida International University's (FIU) DE Program, implemented in conjunction with districts, charter and private schools, has served as a catalyst of community change and hope for a better future.

FIU's DE Program offers a wide range of courses each semester via various modalities. The DE program provides the opportunity for eligible students to take college courses and earn college credits while fulfilling high school requirements. As Miami's only public research university, FIU accounts for a large share of Floridians enrolled in DE programs in the State University System. A unique feature of FIU's DE is that close to 95 percent of the program is offered directly at 72 Florida schools.

### Improved High School Educational Outcomes

By introducing more academic rigor through college-level courses, DE Programs may lead to the improved performance of students in their high school work. Studies have attributed participation in DE courses to improved outcomes among high school students, including being more engaged in school coursework and having a stronger academic and career focus.

Increased Likelihood of Attending College and Educational Access Studies on DE have found a positive correlation between high school students' participation in DE courses and their probability of enrolling in an institution of post-secondary learning.

### Improved Performance in College

Students who had taken DE courses while in high school, when enrolled in college, tend to perform better and graduate from college in a timely manner.

### **ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS**

### At High School, Online, or On FIU Campus Dual Enrollment

In order to enroll in **on campus**, **at high school** or **online** DE courses, students must meet the following requirements:

- Be enrolled in grades 6-12 in a Florida public, charter, private or home school course of study that fulfills requirements for high school graduation
- Have a 3.0 unweighted high school GPA
- Meet the minimum standardized college placement and/or college readiness score according to the <u>Florida</u> <u>Department of Education's Common Placement Testing</u>

### Full-Time/Early Admission Dual Enrollment Program

Students interested in the Full-Time/Early Admission DE program must:

- Be a rising senior in high school
- Have a 3.5 unweighted high school GPA
- Meet a minimum SAT score of 1200 or ACT score of 25

Additionally, students must meet required testing standards for enrollment in courses with pre-requisites (i.e. math courses higher than College Algebra require <u>ALEKS placement exam</u>).

Continued participation in the program requires that students maintain a 3.0 College GPA

#### **PROGRAM TYPES**

### At High School

### Earn college credits at your high school

DE courses can be taken at Partner Schools during the high school academic year. Students earn, at the same time, college credits and credits that fulfill requirements for high school graduation.

Courses are taught by either a high school instructor appointed as an FIU Courtesy Lecturer, or an FIU Faculty or Adjunct Instructor.

#### **Online**

### Take college courses online

Using FIU Canvas, a learning management system that lets you log into your online classroom, students can interact with faculty and other students and take part in a dynamic and interactive fully online course.

Courses are designed to provide students with the same top-quality experience that on-campus students enjoy. Students read chapters, submit assignments, participate in group projects, engage in discussions, reply to message boards and much more.

### Take courses at FIU

On FIU Campus DE students take courses alongside other FIU students. Students can get involved, make new friends, explore interests and make a difference. Don't be just a student—be a Panther!

### Full-Time/Early Admission Dual Enrollment

### High school senior year at FIU

Full-Time/ Early Admission DE allows seniors to complete their final year of high school at FIU. Students enroll in 12-15 college credit hours per semester. This program is not the same as freshmen admission to the university, but you can experience first-hand what life at FIU. Explore the campus, experience arts and culture, enjoy a variety of restaurants, shops and many other available resources.

If you want to explore the life of an FIU Panther, schedule an interview during your junior year with the DE academic advisor.

#### **DUAL ENROLLMENT REGISTRATION PROCESS**

### I. Find Out If You Are Eligible

To earn dual credit, your high school must be a Partner School.

## IN 5 EASY STEPS!

Learn about eligibility criteria,

available <u>Courses</u> and how DE grades impact your college transcript. Then meet with your school guidance counselor to find out if DE is right for you. Home school students should talk with their parent or guardian.

If you're considering Full-Time/Dual Enrollment Early Admission, you'll also need to schedule an interview during your junior year with the DE academic advisor. Interviews are typically held in March. Contact the DE office to schedule an interview.

### 2. Start Your Application

To begin your application, you will register a username and password. That way you can save and return to your application later. Have your contact and identification information ready so that you can complete the application.

Before finishing your application, when you reach the submission confirmation page print the **Parent Consent Form.** When you submit your application, you will be given a **Panther ID** number and your **MyFIU** student account will be created. This will be your lifeline to FIU. If you forget your Panther ID or other login information, recover it at <u>login.fiu.edu</u> by clicking "Need Help?". Learn more about the <u>account recovery process</u>.

### **Returning On FIU Campus Students**

If you are an **On FIU Campus** student who has not participated in the DE program for three or more consecutive semesters, you must complete a new online application.

### 3. Login to MyFIU

Students should visit <u>MyFIU</u> to get familiar with their student account. See <u>First Time Log In</u> for help getting started. For general questions, see <u>Access MyFIU</u>.

If you're still having issues, you can browse the <u>Division of IT Knowledge Base</u> or call customer support at 305-348-2284.

If you are planning to take dual enrollment courses at your high school, you are done!

Submit the Parent Consent Form to your high school instructor or guidance counselor. Learn more about FIU Student Conduct and Honor Code and other important resources.

### 4. Submit On FIU Campus Required Forms

**For On FIU Campus students only**. The forms required include the Common Placement Test Scores, DE Authorization Form, the immunization form, and forms that are applicable to home school students.

Here's what you need (Only for On FIU Campus):

- <u>Dual Enrollment Authorization Form</u> Submitted every semester you take courses at FIU
- Parent Consent Form Found on the submission confirmation page of your application
- <u>Immunization Forms</u> Submitted if you are a new applicant or have been out of the university for three or more consecutive semesters
- Ask your school guidance counselor to assist you with providing <u>Common Placement Testing Scores</u>, and other required exam scores, and/or prerequisites to take the course.

Home education students must also submit:

- Homeschool District Authorization Letter
- Home Education DE Articulation Agreement

Submit all forms to the FIU Dual Enrollment Office at either the Modesto A. Maidique Campus or the Biscayne Bay Campus.

### 5. Register for Classes

This step can only be completed **after** required documents are submitted.

OneStop is your FIU resource for class registration. Find out <u>How to Add</u> <u>Classes</u> on its website. Everything can be completed through your MyFIU account and OneStop is there to help you. You must follow the On FIU Campus <u>dual</u> enrollment deadlines.

### 6. Dropping Classes

On FIU Campus students are responsible for dropping classes, <u>How to Drop Classes</u>. Students who do not drop may receive a failing grade. It is recommended you advise your school guidance counselor to ensure withdrawal does not impact high school credit requirements.



### DUAL ENROLLMENT TRANSFER GUARANTEES & STUDENT RECORDS

### **Dual Enrollment Transfer Guarantees**

Dual enrollment college credit will transfer to any Florida public college or university offering a course with the same prefix and number and must be treated as though taken at the receiving institution. If students do not, upon high school graduation, attend the same college or university where they earned the dual enrollment credit, the application of transfer credit to general education, prerequisite, and degree programs may vary at the receiving institution. Students and parents need to be informed of this caveat.

### **Student Records**

FIU understands and agrees that it is subject to all federal and state laws related to the confidentiality of student information. FIU agrees to comply with the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) and school districts policies and rules pertaining thereto. FIU treats all dual enrollment student information as confidential and will not disclose the student information to any third party, except as provided by law.

According to federal regulations, if a student is attending a postsecondary institution - at any age - the rights under FERPA have transferred to the student. However, in a situation where a student is enrolled in both a high school and a postsecondary institution, the two (2) schools/institutions may exchange information on that student. If the student is under 18, the parents still retain the rights under FERPA at the school and may inspect and review any records sent by the post-secondary institution to the school.

Inasmuch as dual enrollment students are FIU students, FIU faculty and staff "with a legitimate educational interest" may access student records in accordance with all applicable federal and state laws related to the confidentiality of student, as well as FIU and school districts rules.

#### **COURSE SELECTION**

### **Make Wise Decisions**

Explore a wide range of courses including top-ranked online options. Take courses that fulfill high school graduation requirements and are part of the <u>University Core Curriculum</u> (UCC). These are courses required for any first-time college student. Or explore FIU degree pathways by taking electives that match your interest or degree aspirations.

Students in the On FIU Campus program can choose from any classes offered on campus if they satisfy the prerequisites. At High School students can select courses being offered at your school. Talk with a guidance counselor for help choosing courses.

### **On FIU Campus Courses**

**Find a class!** Use <u>Class Search</u> to find available classes each semester. Meet with your school counselor (or parent/legal guardian if you are a home school student) to choose your classes.

Experience classes taught by highly experienced FIU professors. Take courses alongside a diverse community of students. Become an integral part of a university focused on student learning, innovation and collaboration. Don't just be a student - be a Panther!

### **PLEASE NOTE**

Dual Enrollment (DE) courses are rigorous college-level courses. DE course grades become a part of a student's permanent college transcript and are calculated into the student's permanent postsecondary grade point average.

Poor performance in DE courses may affect university admissions and financial aid. It is important to do well in these courses to realize the benefits of DE.

### **At High School Courses**

**Start taking courses!** Meet with your school counselors to choose courses offered at your school. Partner schools offer courses that are part of the College of Arts,

<u>Sciences & Education</u>, the <u>Steven J. Green School of International & Public Affairs</u>, the <u>College of Communication</u>, <u>Architecture + the Arts</u>, the <u>College of Engineering & Computing</u>, the <u>Chaplin School of Hospitality Management</u>, <u>Robert Stempel College of Public Health & Social Work</u> and the <u>College of Business</u>.

Course descriptions can be found by searching course numbers in the <u>Course Catalog</u>.

In providing written consent of eligible sixth-to-eighth graders to participate in dual enrollment courses at FIU, parents acknowledge that FIU is an open campus and that FIU cannot be responsible for the supervision of these sixth (6)-to-eighth (8) grade students beyond the delivery of instruction in the classroom setting. While appropriate for college-level study, course materials and class discussions may reflect topics not typically included in sixth (6)-to-eighth (8) grade courses or high school courses, which some parents may consider advanced for minors. Courses will not be modified to accommodate variations in student age and/or maturity.


#### **FIU Libraries**



### **Discover FIU Admissions Freshman Pathways**

Admission to FIU is selective; applicants are encouraged to apply in the fall of their senior year. FIU takes into consideration an applicant's high school GPA in academic courses, success in dual enrollment courses and standardized test scores for admission to the University. The University values the achievements of applicants who participate in Dual Enrollment through FIU; therefore, additional weight may be given to an applicant who has successfully completed FIU college credit.

### Academic Scholarships

Applicants wishing to be considered for academic scholarships should apply to FIU as a degree-seeking student, and be admitted to FIU, prior to November 1 of their senior year. Scholarships are competitive and an essay, as well as letters of recommendation, are required. Applicants participating in FIU Dual Enrollment, who plan to transition to FIU as a degree-seeking student, are also encouraged to earn micro-scholarships through <u>Raise.Me</u>.
